The Performance Matrix APEL

Single module 15M level credits on the 180-point system

This method of accreditation is aimed at experienced physiotherapists and other professionals in the sport and fitness industries who have attended Module 1 of The Performance Matrix run by KC International (Kinetic Control).

It is expected that students will have taken the opportunity to consolidate their studies by reading around, clinical practice and ongoing attendance at the relevant courses.

The process is an opportunity to allow these students to demonstrate their experiential learning and present their evidence for accreditation.

Students considering applying for APEL need to follow these guidelines

- Attend the KC International 'The Performance Matrix' Module 1 course: - Mandatory
- Attend APEL induction day (mandatory) (there will be support available throughout the APEL time frame).
- Submission of a portfolio consisting of four main sections
 - Section 1 General Supporting Material - In this section the student will present justification for their accreditation of the credits
 - Section 2 Case History – In this section the student will present the profile score of the performance matrix, reasoning, choice of exercises based on the profile, plan of progression, and detail on to how to develop the subject's assets
 - Section 3 Evidence Based Practice - In this section the student will present one issue, taken from the above case history, and present an in-depth discussion around the topic area. The student will use empirical evidence to underpin the discussion. This piece of work should be no longer than 2,500 words
 - Section 4 Presentation of the Evidence – In this section the student is expected to demonstrate how each of the Course learning outcomes has been achieved.
